**Who is this animal living in?**



**Who does this fur belong to?**



**Who do these ears belong to?**



The giraffe holds the record for being the tallest animal. It can be as tall as 5 to 6 metres! At birth, the baby giraffe is already 2 metres tall! Giraffes try to gather together in small groups to defend themselves against lions. The giraffe needs such a long neck to eat the leaves high up in the trees. However, when it needs to drink, it must really do some gymnastics.

### The brown bear



- In Alaska, the bear never hibernates to get 48 feet wet. This is to:
  - catch salmon
  - clean its dirty feet
  - refresh itself when it is too hot
- The bear hibernates. Throughout the winter, it barely moves and sleeps lightly. If it is disturbed during its sleep:
  - it tries to go unharmed
  - it wakes and never returns to its den
  - it needs to sleep and cannot back to sleep for 3 days
- The bear cubs that refuse to stay with their mother:
  - most remain orphaned for 1 hour at the foot of a tree, are attacked and have their skeletons squashed
  - are gnawed at

**Who do these ears belong to?**



The bear is an animal that runs, climbs, jumps, swims and slips. It often stands up on its hind legs, but it only moves about on all fours. It is extremely strong and its legs are 5 cm long. Also, in some regions, it is more of a hunter and does not hesitate to attack large animals such as elk... Other bears mostly eat leaves and berries, etc. However, they all love honey!
