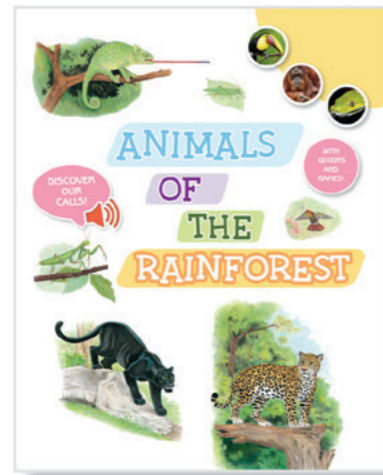
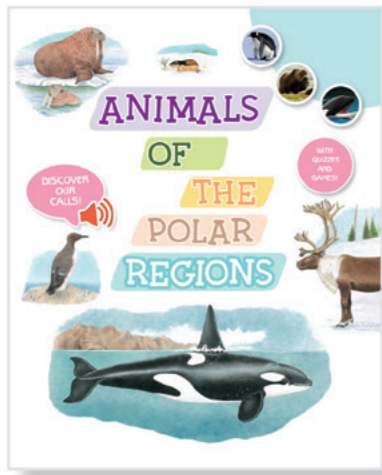
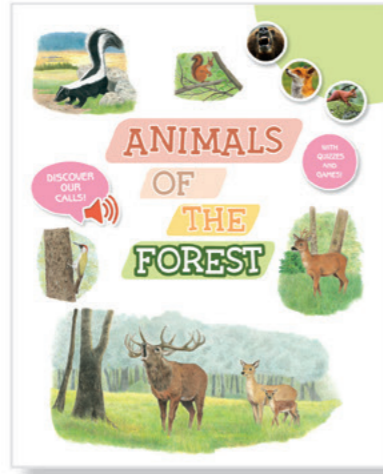
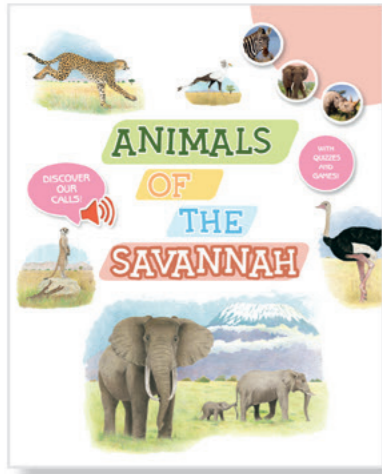


# Discover Animals with Sounds

### The rhinoceros

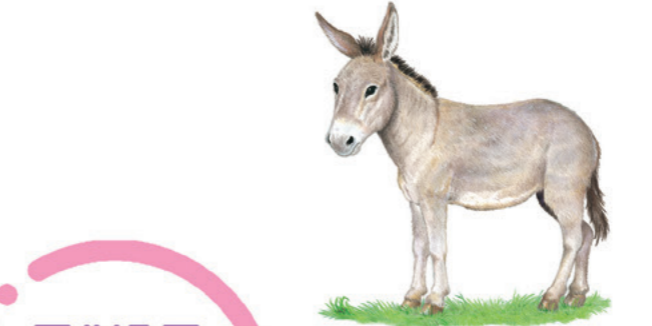
### The cockerel and the hen

In the morning, to wake everybody up and to demonstrate who's in charge, the cockerel lets out his famous 'cock-a-doodle-doo'. The hen, which is brown, or white and brown, spends the day scratching of the ground in search of food. When she is surrounded by her yellow chicks, they really make a racket!

- In 1 year, the hens breed for laying eggs...
  - between 10 and 100 eggs
  - between 250 and 300 eggs
  - about 200 eggs
- Looking at the cockerel and his beautiful feathers, we might guess that he will make it...
  - the turkey
  - the pigeon
  - the pheasant
- The Andalusian breed of hen is very original...
  - it lays blue eggs
  - it always lays on its back
  - the cockerel has the eggs

### The tiger

It is the largest of the hunters. It only eats animals that it has killed. Its striped coat enables it to approach its prey without being seen. Then, it leaps suddenly, drawing out its claws and its enormous teeth. Although it prefers large animals, it also hunts wild boar and hares. However, when a male encounters a female, it purrs like a big pussycat.

- The Malganga, the great tiger of India, hunted the tiger...

- In Asia, many tigers have been killed...

  - to make medicine from their bones
  - to collect their teeth
- Cats don't like water and tigers...
  - are very scared of water
  - only go into the water to take short baths
  - are excellent swimmers and are even good at fishing

### The brown bear

The bear is an animal that runs, climbs, jumps, swims and digs. It often stands up on its hind legs, but it only moves about on all fours. It is extremely strong and its legs are 5 cm long claws. In some regions, it is more of a hunter and does not hesitate to attack large animals such as elk. Other bears mostly eat leaves and berries, etc. However, they all love honey!

- In Alaska, the bear never hesitates to get its feet wet. This is to...
  - catch salmon
  - clean its dirty feet
  - scratch itself when it is too hot
- The bear hibernates throughout the winter. It barely moves and sleeps lightly. If it is disturbed during its sleep...
  - it tries to get annoyed
  - it roars and howls relative to its den
  - it leaves its den and comes back as soon as it can
- The bear cubs that refuse to obey their mother...
  - most remain punished for 1 hour of the foot
  - are smacked and have their bottoms spotted
  - are growled at
